An exciting opportunity exists to join our team at the [Child Development Centre in Prince George, B.C.](#), on the traditional and unceded territory of the Lheildi T'enneh First Nation and Dakelh speaking peoples. This is a unionized position.

Reporting to the Lead Physiotherapist, this position will provide support to the early intervention therapy team, including:

- Assisting with occupational and physical therapy activities as appropriate including groups;
- Preparing, adapting, organizing, storing, and cleaning therapeutic resources;
- Assisting with appointment bookings and reminder calls; and
- Other related duties as assigned.

This position will be partially funded under the youth-focused, Canada Summer Jobs Program. As such, the successful applicant will be 30 years old or younger at the beginning of the employment period and a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or have refugee status.

Minimum Hiring Criteria:

- Completion of Grade 12 plus recent, related experience or an equivalent combination of relevant education, training or experience or other qualifications determined to be reasonable and relevant to the level of work
- Acceptable criminal records check
- Valid British Columbia driver's license
- Preference may be given to applicants actively working towards completing studies in a related therapy health profession
